GOD'S PURPOSE OF CIVIL GOVERNMENT

Government – God's Plan vs. Satan's Scheme: Overview

"We believe the Bible instructs us to build biblical churches and Christian lives, and not to try and force a secular community outside the church to do the same or legislate the same." So wrote the senior pastor of a respected evangelical church in a Texas suburb in response to other pastors and Christian leaders rising up to oppose an ordinance that granted special legal status and protections to immoral sexual behaviors and gender confusion. In that short excerpt and his lengthier blog posting, this pastor displayed an all-to-common "straw man" misrepresenting Scripture and ignoring the history of the Christian church.

Consider a few common questions that resonate from both pulpit and pew in America:

- What is the Biblical role of the individual believer regarding civil government in the United States of America as well as that of The Church as a body?
- Is it true that we cannot "legislate morality?"
- Is taking a pacifist position toward governing bodies at city, county, state and federal levels the more "righteous" and "compassionate" action?
- Does "political involvement" harm the evangelistic efforts of individuals or churches?
- Is it the Pastor's, individual believer's or the church body's "business" what happens at City Hall, the State Capitol or Washington D.C?
- Is there a God-given mandate for Christians to vote in elections in which we choose people for government offices from the school board to the White House?

Without claiming to have the final and all-encompassing, Biblically-correct answer we will address these questions directly and challenge those who disagree to likewise defend their differences with a sound Biblical, legal and historical basis. The first step is to establish some basic parameters or presuppositions that dictate our beliefs, values and actions.

First things first. We believe that answers to every life principle, question, dilemma or problem facing mankind are contained in the Holy Scriptures and that scripture alone, without supplement, provides the only valid basis upon which to determine that which is sinful or righteous, moral or immoral, right or wrong. (2 Timothy 3:16)

Second, we assert that the concept of governing stewardship was given by God in what Dr. D. James Kennedy called the Cultural Mandate (Genesis 1:27-30), affirmed by Jesus (Matthew 8:9), it's first principles confirmed (Genesis 9:6), parameters of equal justice provided (Exodus 21) and its ultimate accountability in all forms to Jesus Christ, seated at the right hand of God, via the "preamble" to the Great Commission in Matthew 28:18 and applied to all times and places via Romans 13:1-10.

The simple – and correct – interpretation of all this is that all authority comes from the throne of God in the spiritual realm, flows to His appointed stewards responsible for His creation in the physical realm, assigned to followers of Jesus Christ as part of our mandate and the institutional separation confirmed as per Matthew 22:21.

"Separation of Church and State" properly means that each institution has a distinct jurisdiction. The Church is to serve as the means by which the spiritual, moral, physical and philosophical needs of individuals are to be served, The State/government is to serve to restrain and punish those who would violate the life, health, property or freedom of another. The sword of lethal force to enforce the civil laws is properly placed only in the institution of civil government but cannot be separated from God's laws of morality and justice.

Applying these principles to the Constitutional Republic that is the United States of America, the framers, signers and those who ratified the U.S. Constitution drafted in 1787 and the "corporate bylaws" of the nation asserted an historic principle that was being dusted off after 3,000 years.

Self-government. Government of the people, by the people, for the people.

Common Christian Questions Related To "Politics":

- *The State/government* is to protect the life, property and freedom of the innocent and punish those who would violate those rights.

BASIS BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES OF CIVIL GOVERNMENT


INTRODUCTION: As we walk through the following sequence of scriptures there is a distinct and evident set of principles that this verses highlight only, yet provide a very clear path to understanding of God's intended purpose for the legitimate use of governing <u>AUTHORITY</u>.

	al view of this topic has caused tragic results with life and death consequences in the lives people!
1.	- "All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness; so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work."
	Principle: Since all creation and its order are designed by, for and through God, it is self-evident that Scripture speaks to every aspect of life including His purpose for governing authority.
<u>.</u>	- "God created man in His own image, in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them. God blessed them; and God said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth, and subdue it; and rule over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the sky and over every living thing that moves on the earth."
	Principle: God created man and embedded in us His character qualities with a perfect balance of justice and mercy, to be a steward/caretaker over the physical creation and all in it.
	– "Whoever sheds man's blood, By man his blood shall be shed, For in the image of God He made man."
	Principle: God reminded us that the flood did not eradicate sin and declared that murder was still in the hearts of men. This passage also affirms that the highest purpose of civil authority is to protect innocent life as well as provide for punishment equal to the crime of capital murder.
•	- "Furthermore, you shall select out of all the people <u>able men</u> who <u>fear God</u> , <u>men of truth</u> , those who <u>hate dishonest gain</u> ; and you shall place <i>these</i> over them <i>as</i> leaders of thousands, of hundreds, of fifties and of tens.
	Principle: The specific four-fold standard given by God to choose men or women for governing ministry at any level is based on capability, faith, integrity and character. Carelessly choosing the unqualified, the ungodly, the dishonest or the self-interested will always result in tyrannical and corrupt government. This passage among many prove that God cares and has spoken to us.
•	_ "But if there is <i>any further</i> injury, then you shall appoint <i>as a penalty</i> life for life, ²⁴ eye for eye, tooth for tooth, hand for hand, foot for foot, ²⁵ burn for burn, wound for wound, bruise for bruise."
	Principle: The basis of equal justice under civil law is that the punishment for a crime must fit its severity – e.g. we don't use capital punishment for petty theft.
5.	"6 But the thing was [a] displeasing in the sight of Samuel when they said, 'Give us a king to judge us.' And Samuel prayed to the Lord. ⁷ The Lord said to Samuel, 'Listen

to the voice of the people in regard to all that they say to you, <u>for they have not rejected you, but they have rejected Me from being king over them.'" (emphasis added)</u>

Principle: The people sought protection, security and provision from an earthly,

human king and wrongly giving him the centralized authority properly reserved only for God. 7. ______ - "So Samuel spoke all the words of the Lord to the people who had asked of him a king. 11 He said, 'This will be the procedure of the king who will reign over you." *Principle:* When the people their trust in and yield their rights to another man or government to provide what only God can and should, the fruits are tyranny. 8. ______ – "When the righteous are in <u>authority</u>, the people rejoice: but when the wicked beareth rule, the people mourn." Principle: Godly governing protects the life, liberty and property of the innocent, while evil men and women abuse governing to authority steal, kill and destroy. 9. - "But Samuel said, 'What have you done?' And Saul said, 'Because I saw that the people were scattering from me, and that you did not come within the appointed days...I forced myself and offered the burnt offering.' Samuel said to Saul, 'You have acted foolishly; you have not kept the commandment of the Lord your God...now your kingdom shall not endure." Principle: The jurisdiction of the spiritual and moral condition of the people was given to "The Church"; the king/government has no authority in that domain. 10. _____ - "For I also am a man under *authority*, with soldiers under me; and I say to this one, 'Go!' and he goes, and to another, 'Come!' and he comes, and to my slave, 'Do this!" and he does it." Principle: Authority is an intangible power from the heavenly/spiritual domain that has tangible and measurable impact in the earthly/physical domain. 11. _____ - "They said to Him, "Caesar's." Then He said to them, 'Then render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's; and to God the things that are God's." Principle: There is a legitimate "separation of church and state" that is clearly ordained by God and unique to Judeo-Christian nations....government has no authority over the beliefs and religious practices of the people unless they violate the rights of others. 12. _____ - "And Jesus came up and spoke to them, saying, "All <u>authority</u> has been given to Me in heaven and on earth."



BONUS SCRIPTURE: 1 Peter 2:13-17 - "Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every human institution, whether to a king as the one in authority, ¹⁴ or to governors as sent by him for the punishment of evildoers and the praise of those who do right. ¹⁵ For such is the will of God that by doing right you may silence the ignorance of foolish men. ¹⁶ Act as free men, and do not use your freedom as a covering for evil, but use it as bondslaves of God. ¹⁷ Honor all people, love the brotherhood, fear God, honor the king."

PRINCIPLE: Christians should be the BEST, MOST ACTIVE citizens!

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSION:

Since Romans 13 uses the analogy of "the sword" to illustrate the lethal force biblically given to rightful governing **authority**; since in the USA "We the People" are the governing **authority**; since we transfer that **authority** to a fellow citizen to make laws in government by our vote; since those representatives give **authority** to our law enforcers; since our law enforcers in 21st Century America do not carry swords as standard issue but rather a semi-automatic handgun (i.e. 9 mm Glock)...<u>therefore the</u> Badge/handgun is a legitimate illustration of THE VOTE/GOD'S AUTHORITY.

<u>To Whom will YOU give YOUR GUN? EVERY Christian Will Vote in EVERY Election in one of these four methods</u>:

- 1. <u>Wiping down the prints, filing off the serial number; toss gun into the street:</u> Those who don't register and don't vote. The gun/authority doesn't go away just because you don't show up...who picks it up?
- 2. Leaving the serial number on, the toss gun into the street: Registered to vote but never or rarely cast a vote. The gun/authority doesn't go away...
- 3. Registering gun, giving gun based on self-serving reasons: Vote like Dad voted; blind political party allegiance, race, "pocketbook" benefits, etc. All surface, nothing to do with principles, character, etc.
- 4. <u>Prayerfully, entrusting our gun to man or woman based on Exodus</u>
